Participles

Definition:

Participle - is an impersonal form of the English verb that has the properties of a verb, adverb and an adjective.

There are 2 forms of English participles:

1. Present Participle (Participle I)
2. Past Participle (Participle II)

Present Participle - Examples	
They are watching a new film now.	
They were watching a new film at that time last night.	
They will be watching a new film at this time tomorrow.	
Look at the man crossing the street.	
Shouting will not do any good.	

Past Participle - Examples	
Clara looked at the broken vase.	
Clara looked at the vase broken by someone.	
I want the work done immediately.	
The museum was opened only last year.	
Flowers are grown almost in any part of the world.
